Department of Archives and History [3]. The newsletter reported on historical activities in the department and around the state and served as an organ of the North Carolina Literary and Historical Association [4]. Much of the information that had been appearing in the "Historical News" section of the North Carolina Historical Review [5] was absorbed by Carolina Comments. In the late 1970s the newsletter took on a more structured format, with regular reports from each section in the Division of Archives and History; news from state, county, and local historical organizations as well as colleges and universities; feature stories; and occasional articles. It continues to be published six times a year (January, March, May, July, September, and November) until 2003.

In 2003, *Carolina Comments* became a quarterly publication. Beginning with Volume 59, number 1 (January 2011) the North Carolina Office of Archives and History issued *Carolina Comments* electronically and ceased print publication. In January 2013, the Office published the last issue of *Carolina Comments*, and moved to a social media based version of the publication. Copies of the publication are aviailable in the North Carolina Digital Collections [6].
