### **Frank Porter Graham Child Development Center**

The Frank Porter Graham Child Development Center <sup>[2]</sup> is a multidisciplinary organization in the Division of Health Affairs <sup>[3]</sup> at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill <sup>[4]</sup>. It was established in 1966 to study children and families, especially those children at risk for hindered development due to biological or environmental factors. The center's mission is to "produce scientific work related to children and families, offer services to young children and families in a model child care program and other community settings, provide effective technical assistance, consultation, and materials that use proven knowledge and practices, and educate new professionals through teaching and mentoring." Almost every project at the center focuses on early child development, mainly between birth and age six. Historically, projects have clustered in five areas: child development and intervention studies, family studies, health studies, technical assistance, and professional development. What distinguishes Frank Porter Graham from comparable units at other universities is its broad focus. In addition to concentrating on children reared in poverty, it studies normal development processes and child care services. Its progressive program includes studies that integrate health and behavioral status.

Since its establishment, the center has grown from three trailers on Cameron Avenue to more than 40,000 square feet in three separate Chapel Hill locations. By the early 2000s the center's annual budget was more than \$17 million, with most of the funds coming from federal grants issued by the U.S. Department of Education and other national organizations. The center employs about 250 staff members, about 100 of whom are full-time. Of the full-time staff, Environmental Protection Agency <sup>[5]</sup> nonfaculty serve as primary investigators.
