Secotan was a large village of Algonquian-speaking Indians that was encountered in July 1585 along both banks of the <u>Pamlico River</u> [2] by <u>Sir Richard Grenville</u> [3], an explorer sent by <u>Sir Walter Raleigh</u> [4]. The village was documented in a detailed watercolor drawing by <u>John White</u> [5] in 1585-86. Titled "<u>Indian Village of Secotan</u> [6]," the drawing depicts a well-ordered village with family units, storehouses, fields with growing crops, and individuals performing different tasks. In 1690, <u>Bath</u> [7], the first town of English settlers in North Carolina, was established in the vicinity of Secotan, which had been abandoned by the Indians.
