University v. Foy, a case decided by the <u>North Carolina Supreme Court</u> [2] in 1805, was brought by the<u>University of North</u> <u>Carolina</u> [3] to protect property it had acquired pursuant to its statutory right to<u>escheats</u> [4]-property owned by a person who dies without a will or known heirs and which passes to the state. The political background of the case was a struggle between the <u>Anti-Federalists</u> [5], who controlled the<u>General Assembly</u> [6], and the university, described as a "hotbed of <u>Federalists</u> [7]." In an early exercise of judicial review, the state supreme court upheld the university's right to the property.
