

the Internet Archive. [2]Kenneth Raynor Ellington, partner in architectural firm, was born in Clayton, the son of Jesse and Sallie Williamson Ellington. In 1914 he received the LL.B. degree from <u>The University of North Carolina</u> [3] where he was a member of Gorgon's Head, an honorary society. After serving in the Navy Air Corps during<u>World War I</u> [4], he joined the architectural office of his brother Douglas in Asheville and participated in the work of the firm(*See* <u>Ellington, Douglas D</u> [5].) A <u>Baptist</u> [6], he married Margaret Roberts in 1922 and they were the parents of a son, Eric Edward.
