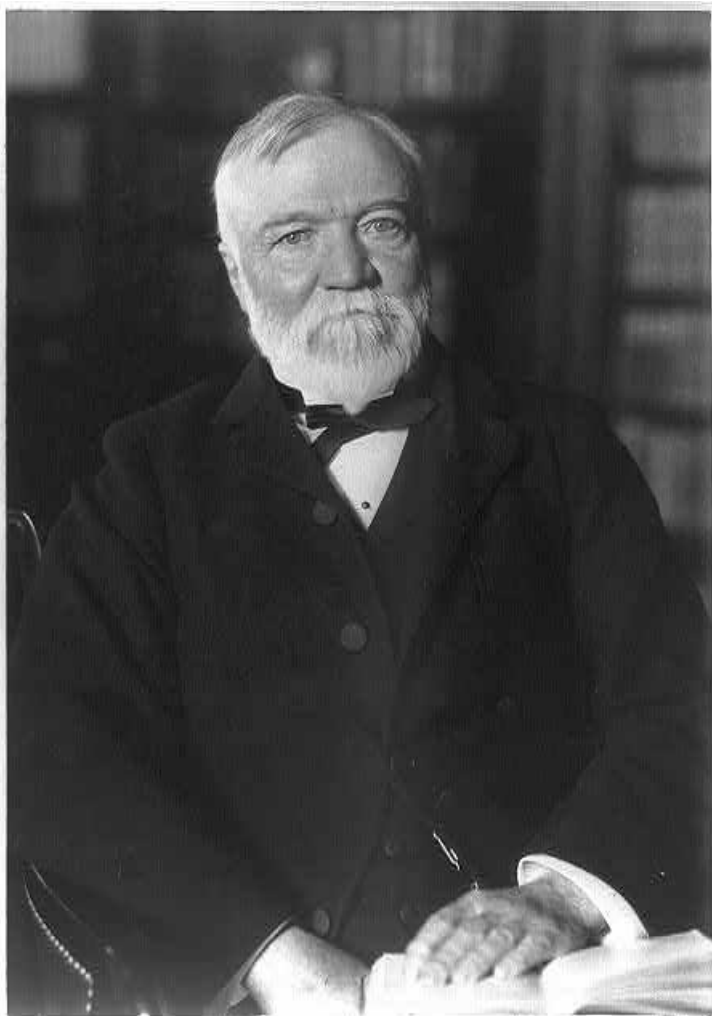
Andrew Carnegie
