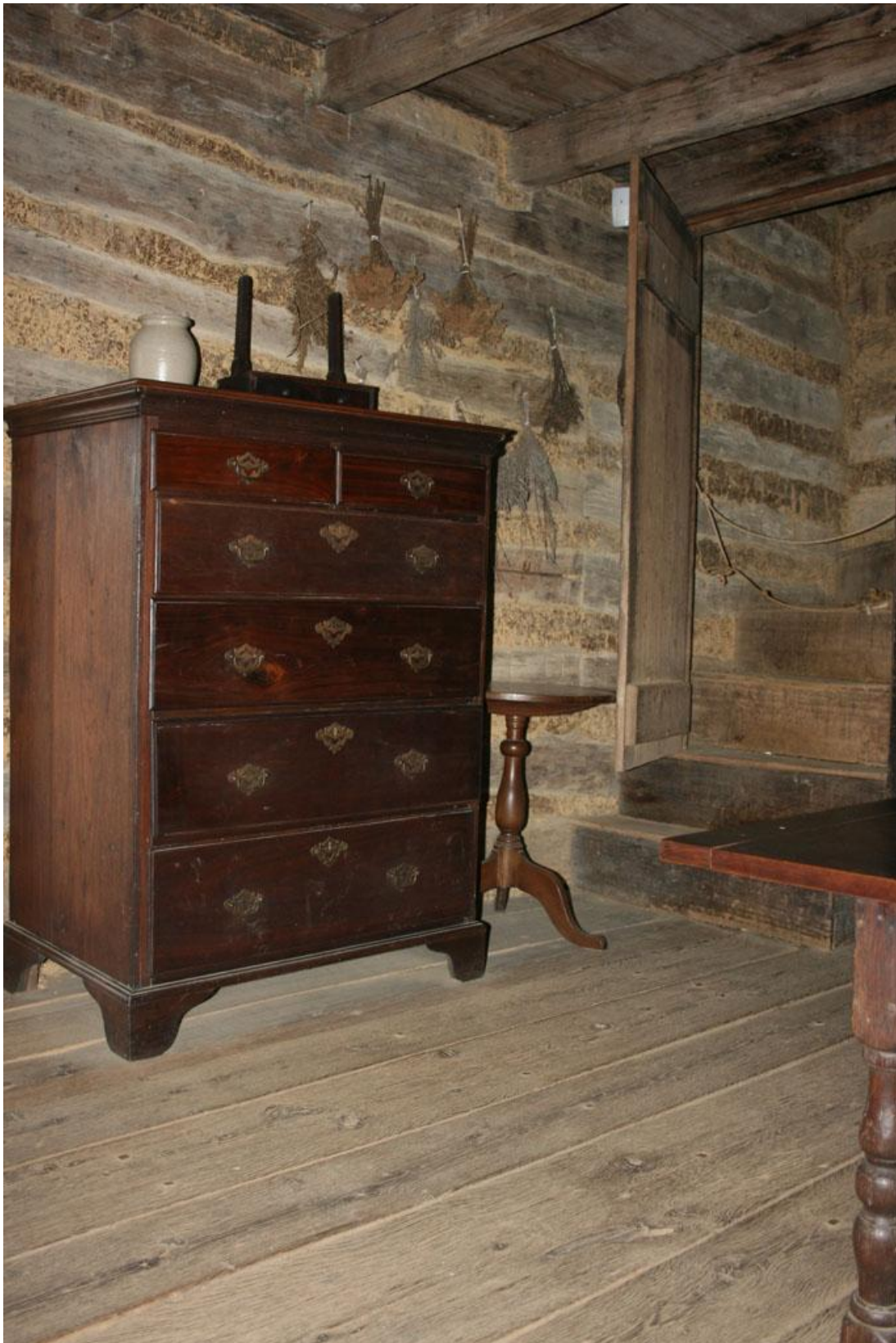


## Allen House colonial dresser
