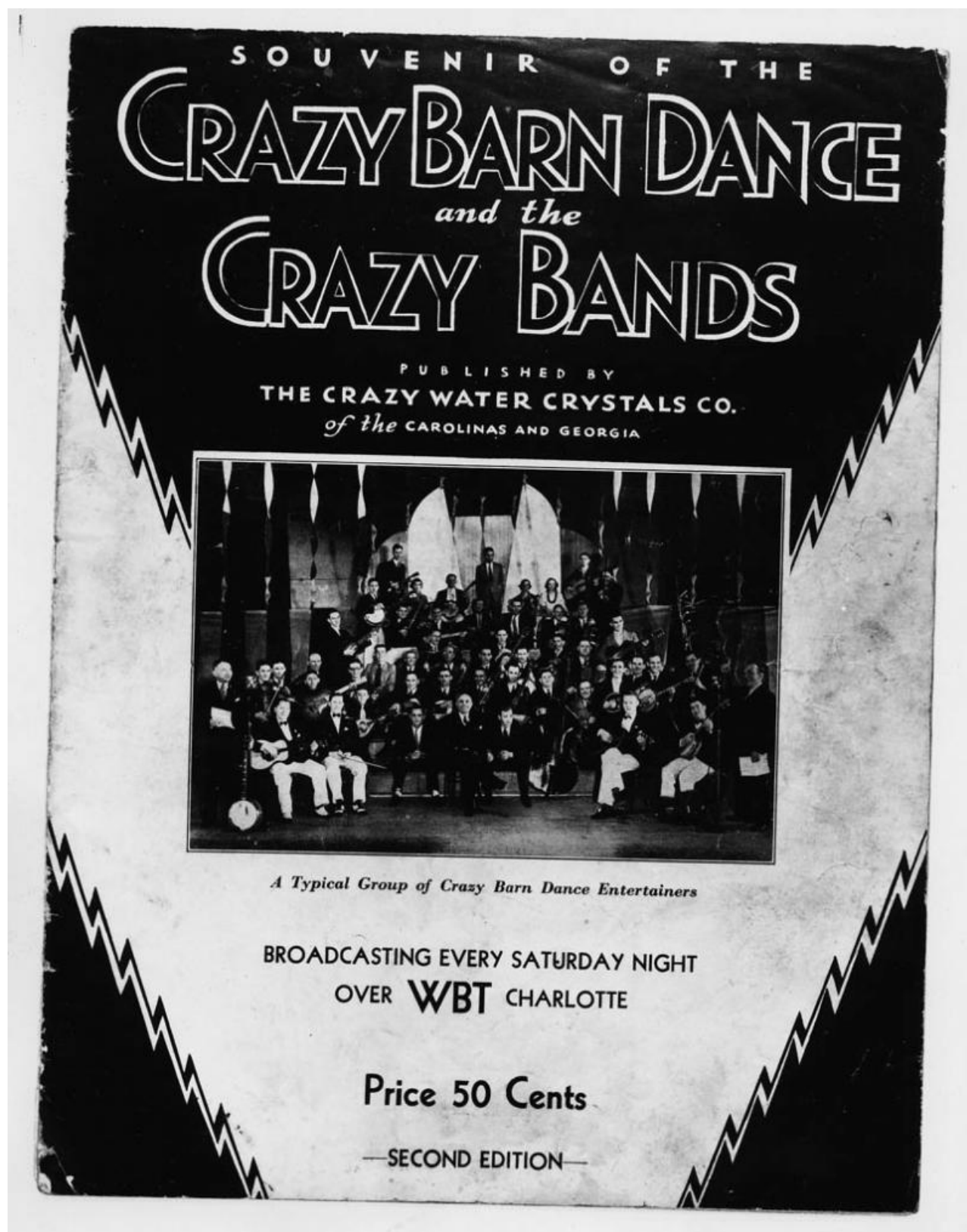


Souvenir of the Crazy Barn Dance
