At Ravana's behest, his niece transforms herself to impersonate Sita and then pretends she is dead to fool Rama. She floats down a river and across the sea all the way to a river bank where Rama and his younger brother Laksman are camping. Ravana expects they will stop pursuing Sita if they are convinced she has died.
