In the Ramayana, Garuda answers tha arrow signal by flying down to attack the serpents plaguing Rama's troops. In the right section of this frame--just over the bushes from the scene where they struggle with serpents, Rama, Laksman and the monkey troops are continuing on their journey through the forest.
