

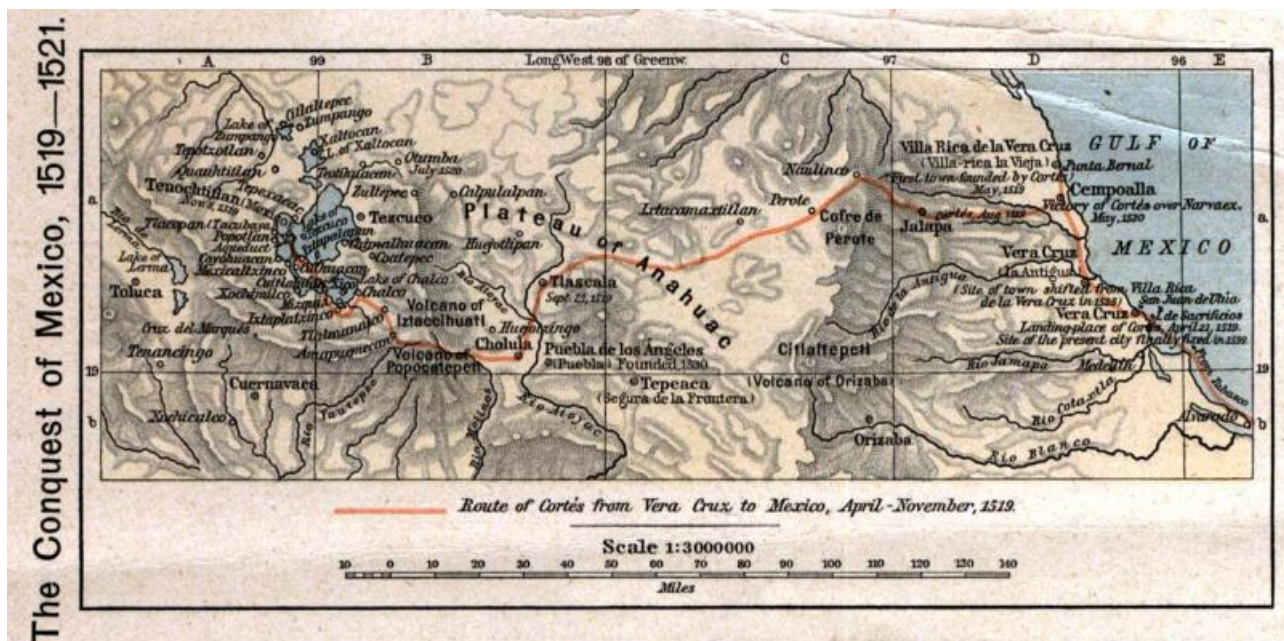
A map depicting the invasion route taken by Hernán Cortés

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This map represents the route Hernán Cortés and his men followed during the Spanish Conquest of Mexico. Cortés and his men battled their way through Mexico from 1519 to 1521.

The Spanish Conquest of Mexico refers to the conquest of the Mexica/Aztec empire in particular. While the Yucatán Peninsula is part of modern-day Mexico, it was not part of the Spanish Conquest of Mexico.

Cortés was a member of the Spanish generation of conquistadors, a name referring to soldiers, explorers, and adventures who were instrumental in the Spanish colonization of the Americas. Cortés, in particular, was a famous and particularly successful conquistador for Spain.



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
