

[3]Bethel Regiment was the popular name of the first regiment of volunteers raised in North Carolina at the beginning of the <u>Civil War</u> [4]. Commanded by Col. <u>Daniel Harvey Hill</u> [5], it played a significant role in winning the first land battle of the conflict at <u>Bethel</u> [6], Va., on 10 June 1861. The first Confederate soldier from the state to be killed in action, <u>Henry Lawson Wyatt</u> [7], died there.
