"Lost provinces" was a term applied to the region of North Carolina consisting of the counties of [Currituck](#) <sup>[3]</sup>, [Camden](#) <sup>[4]</sup>, [Pasquotank](#) <sup>[5]</sup>, [Perquimans](#) <sup>[6]</sup>, [Chowan](#) <sup>[7]</sup>, and [Gates](#) <sup>[8]</sup>. Because of their location north of the Albemarle Sound and the presence of [rivers](#) <sup>[9]</sup> and [swamps](#) <sup>[10]</sup>, they were isolated and difficult to reach except through Virginia.
