The Socialist Party of North Carolina (SPNC), formed in 1996, is the modern affiliate of the national Socialist Party, which was organized in July 1901 by the merger of the <u>Social Democratic Party</u> [3], under <u>Eugene V. Debs</u> [4], with the reformer wing of the <u>Socialist Labor Party</u> [5], under <u>Morris Hillquit</u> [6]. The SPNC has small, organized groups in <u>Raleigh</u> [7] and <u>Jacksonville</u> [8]. In the 2000 presidential election, for the first time since 1936, a Socialist Party member was an official write-in candidate in North Carolina. In the early 2000s the SPNC was involved in a variety of causes, including a boycott of <u>Mt. Olive Pickles</u> [9] and <u>People of Faith against the Death Penalty</u> [10]. Again as a write-in, the national Socialist Party presidential candidate in 2004, <u>Walter Brown</u> [11], received about 300 votes in North Carolina.
