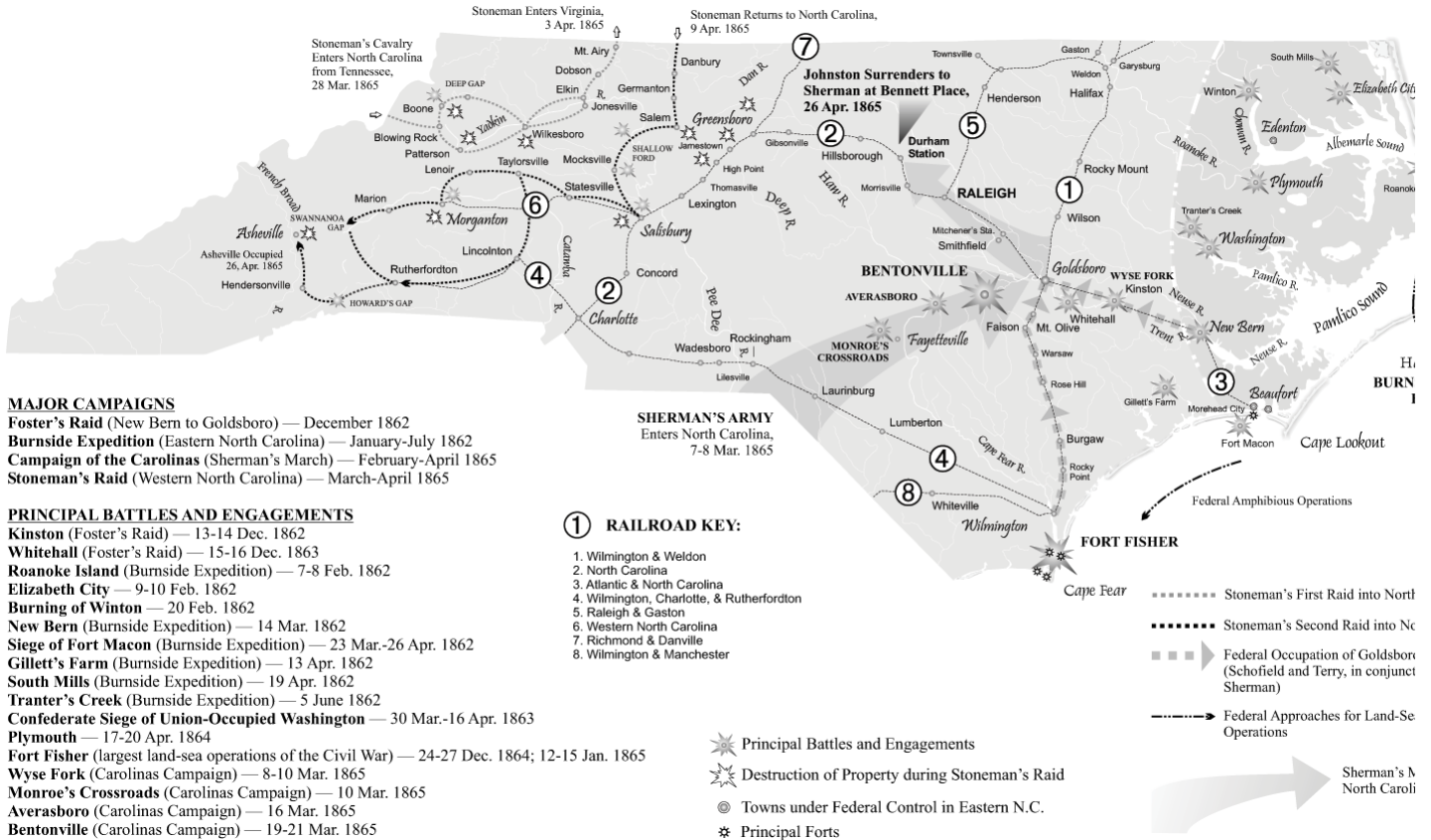


## Civil War Battles <sup>[1]</sup>

### Civil War Battles

Although there was much [division in the state](#) <sup>[2]</sup> concerning secession, North Carolina did [secede](#) <sup>[3]</sup> on May 20, 1861. General Joseph Johnston surrendered the last major Confederate Army to General William Sherman near Durham on April 26, 1865.
