## What element would you be? student sheet

## **Purpose:**

Write a one page story that compares your personality, ambitions and interests to an element from the periodic table.

## **Background:**

We have discussed how the structure of an atoms and electron configuration help us to understand chemical and physical behaviors of the elements of the periodic table. We also know that an element's location on the periodic table allows us to understand its' chemical and physical properties.

## **Activities:**

- Use your knowledge of periodic trends, reactivity, bonding, and atomic structure to select an element that you would be if you were an element on the periodic table.
- Write a one-page story that entertains the reader and relates your personality and character to
  the chosen element. Use concepts such as location on the periodic table, chemical reactivity,
  periodic trends (ionic radius, ionization energy, electronegativity), and physical properties, as
  well as sources and uses of the element to help you relate the element to yourself.
- Create a list of ideas that can be used to relate you to your chosen element. Organize these ideas before you begin to write. You must make at least four different comparisons.
- Turn in a final copy, neatly written and in ink, prior to the end of class for full credit.
